PREVIOUS COUNCIL DISCUSSION: July 17, 2025

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND **CHAPTER 9 – LICENSING AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, ARTICLE IV – MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS REGULATIONS** SECTION 9-109(d)(12) OF THE **CITY OF HINESVILLE** CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ALLOW MOBILE FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS TO OPERATE WITHIN 200 FEET OF BRICK-AND-MORTAR RESTAURANTS WHEN THE MOBILE FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT IS OWNED AND OPERATED BY THE SAME ENTITY AS THE BRICK-AND-MORTAR RESTAURANT; **TO PROVIDE AN ADOPTION DATE**; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES ALLOWED BY LAW.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City of Hinesville has established regulations governing the operation of mobile food service establishments within the City limits; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hinesville desires to support small business growth, promote food diversity, and ensure public health and safety;

WHEREAS, the operation of mobile food trucks must be regulated to protect the welfare of the public and promote and maintain safe pedestrian and vehicular traffic flow;

WHEREAS, the City of Hinesville desires to allow the owners of brick-and-mortar restaurants to operate mobile food service establishments on the same premises as said brick-and-mortar restaurant;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HINESVILLE, GEORGIA that **CHAPTER 9 – LICENSING AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, ARTICLE IV – MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS REGULATIONS SECTION 9-109(d)(12)** be amended to read as follows:

Mobile food service establishments may **NOT** conduct business within 200 feet of a brick-and-mortar restaurant as measured from the main entrance of the restaurant to the main service window of the mobile food service establishment. Exceptions: Mobile food service establishments within a food park are exempted from this restriction; and mobile food establishments owned and operated by a brick-and-mortar restaurant may conduct business on the premises of the brick-and-mortar restaurant. ~~provided that the required 200-foot distance is maintained from other brick-and-mortar restaurants.~~

SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance.

CONFLICTS

All other ordinances or portions of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance, or inconsistent with the directive(s) of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

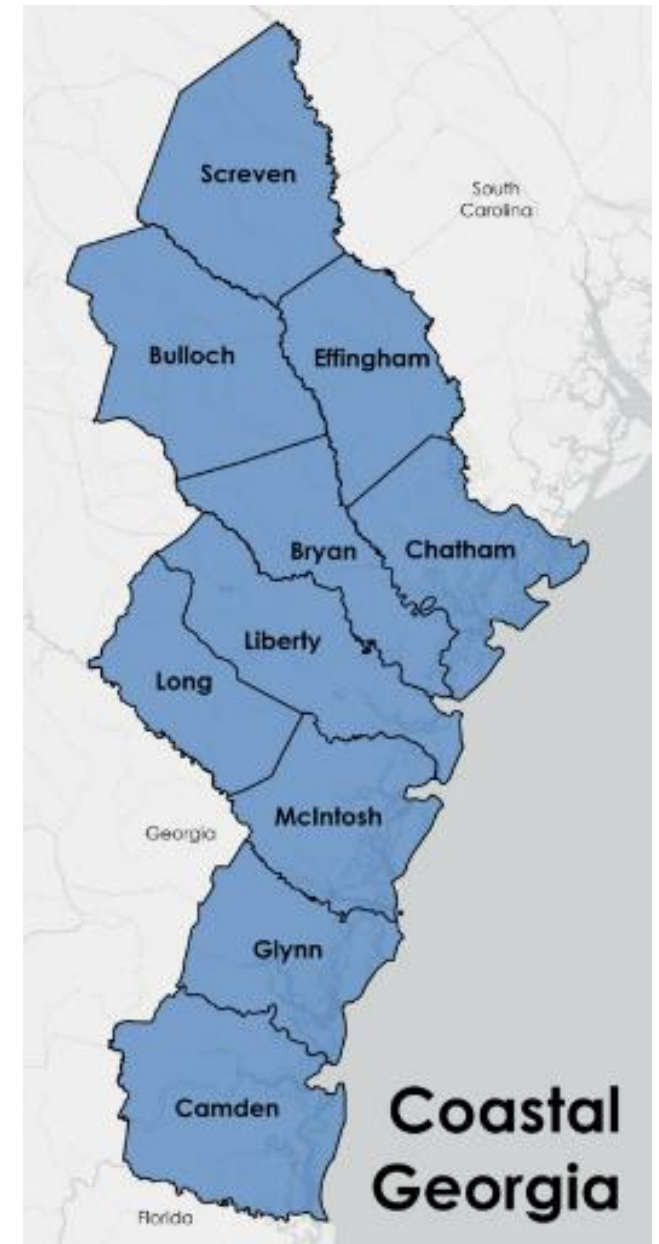

1. Foundation for community and regional planning in the state.
2. Acknowledges that "Coordinated and comprehensive planning by all levels of government within the State of Georgia is of vital importance to the state and its citizens".

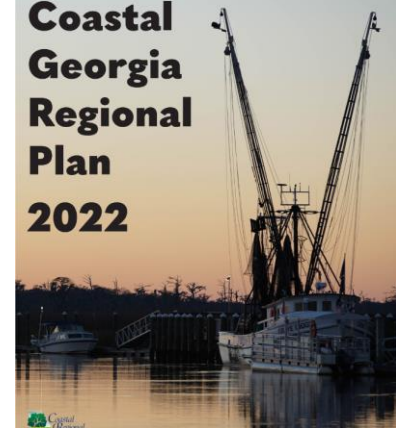

Modernizing Hydrant Inspections – Hinesville Fire Department

From Paper Logs to Digital Data

Firefighter Joshua Rath – C Shift

Project Overview

- **Old system:** Manual Maps → Handwritten notes → manual entry → delayed reporting
 - **New system:** Google Forms on mobile → real-time spreadsheet → Google Earth mapping
 - **Objective:** Increase accuracy, speed, accountability across shifts
-

Challenges with the Old Workflow

- Lost or illegible paper forms
 - Manual transcription errors
 - 3–5 day lag before inspection data is available in ESO
 - Inability to easily identify missed hydrants or track repairs
-

How the New Digital System Works

- Crews submit inspections via Google Forms on phones/tablets
 - Immediate sync to central dashboard where inputs will be categorized and cached
 - Automated “Completed” flag per hydrant with removal from the map display on update
 - Google Earth map color-coded by shift and status if the need for one “shift map” arises for ease of access (one map link moving forward)

Immediate Benefits

- **Accuracy:** Error rate drops from ~14% to <1%
 - **Speed:** Inspection data viewable instantly
 - **Accountability:** Missed hydrants flagged automatically and immediately
 - **Efficiency:** Reporting time cut from hours to minutes because of labels from ESO

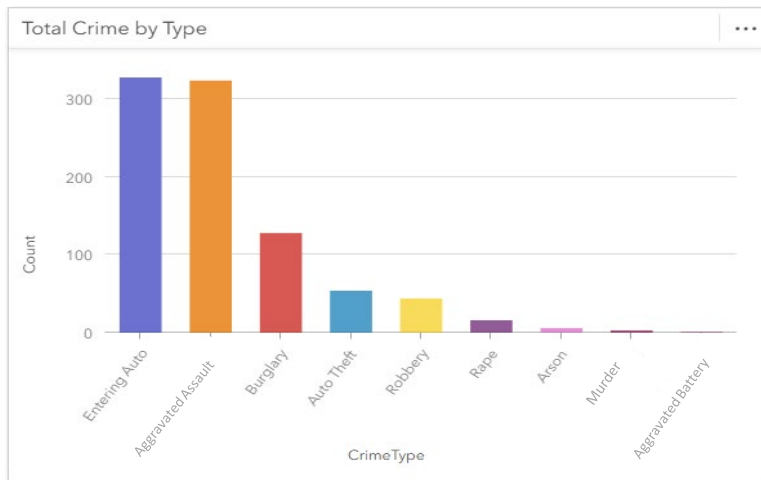
Total Crime per Month



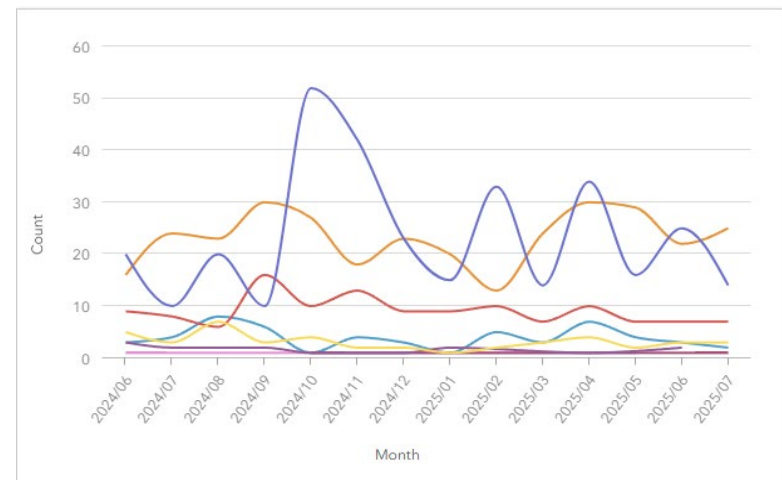
Total Crime per Council District in the last 12 months



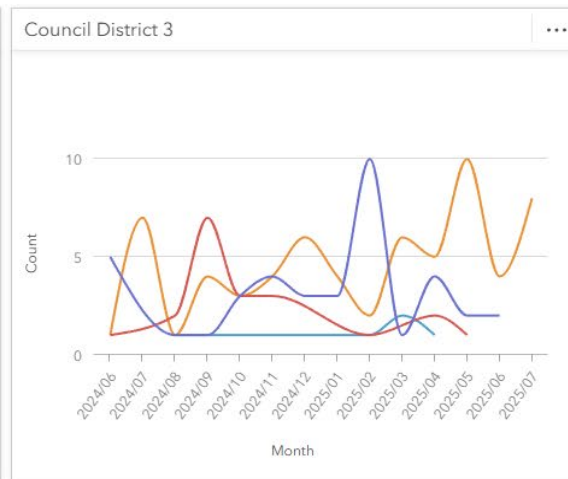
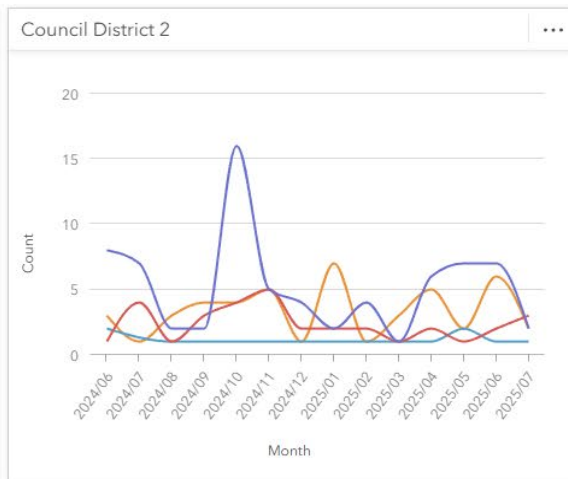
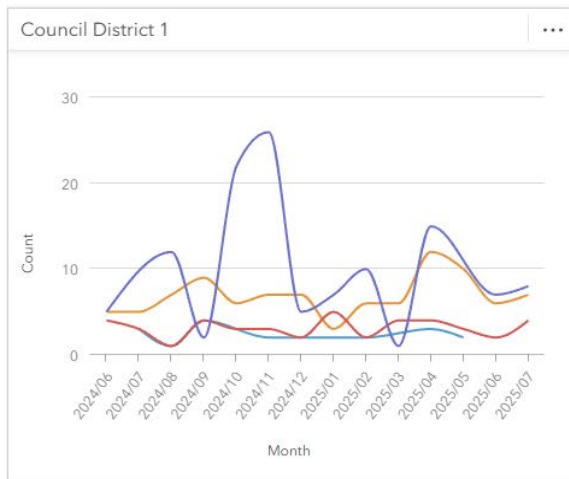
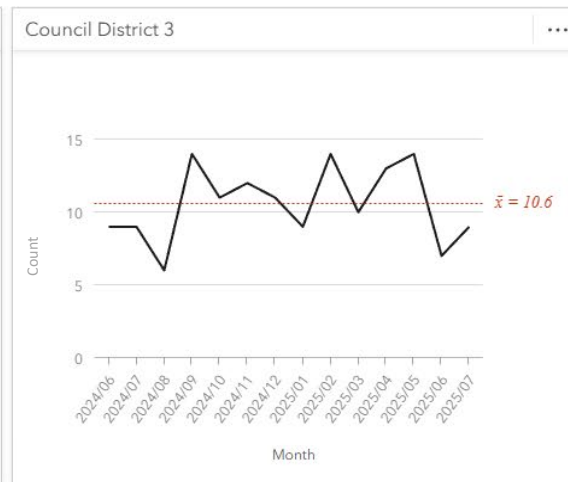
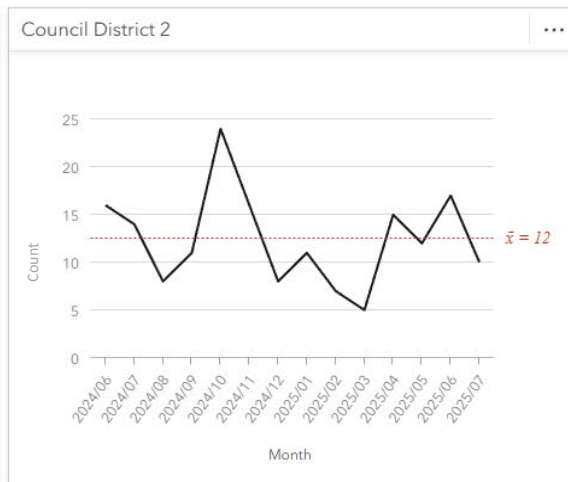
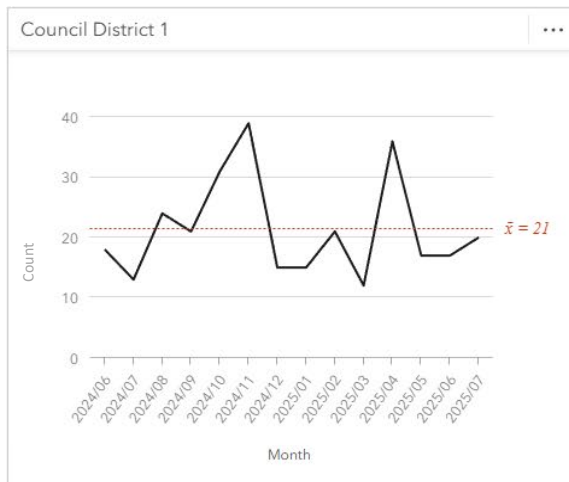
Total Crime by Type in the last 12 months

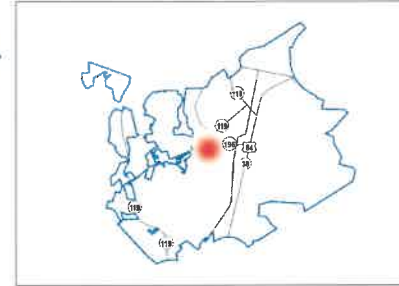

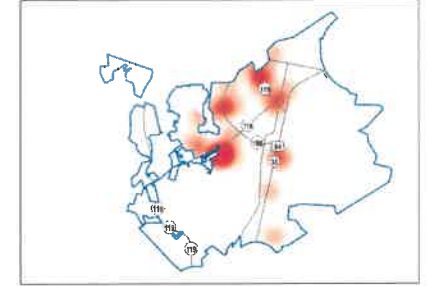
